Karol Sekta chose for his bachelor thesis a comparison of two controversial photographers Sally Mann and David Hamilton. Obvious connection of their work and the point of departure of the of the thesis lies in an archetype of a nymphet. Nonetheless we don't really get to any closer determination of the concept. Author proceeds from stylistic analysis of work of both photographers to general characterization of "worlds" they represent. Last and most significant part of the text is dedicated to literary and cinema context of their work.

I must appreciate the vast amount of literature, that would actually deserve itself some concise introduction or bibliographical note, and numerous footnotes. Nonetheless, what the work of Karol Sekta lacks is more critical approach to both the artworks and the secondary literature. Often it is hard to distinguish whether author just refers to other sources or whether he actually articulates his own points.

The common points of work of Sally Mann and David Hamilton the author identified are quite naturally not only the subject matter, but also the ambivalence in respect to moral and aesthetic issues, interference or direct engagement of the photographer himself or herself and last but not least their literary and cinema references.

In this respect and even within rather brief conclusion Karol Sekta offers neat introduction and comparison but the research itself does not offer much new. Therefore lack of critical resolution, originality and dependence on stylistic biographical levels of analysis are the most visible limits of the thesis. On the other hand I must admit the scope of artistic references and secondary literature and apparent personal involvement of the author are admirable.

I hereby recommend the thesis to be approved with overall evaluation C.

Questions for the oral examination:

- 1. How would you structure or critically asses the secondary literature on the authors; more precisely which interpretational frameworks or attitudes are prevalent or how have they evolved?
- 2. In the very end of the work you ponder on the "criterion of reverie" implying that there is no determinate interpretation of the works of both photographers. Can you elaborate this idea further?
