Verbal evaluation of the thesis including questions that the candidate must address in his/her thesis defence:

The thesis analyses a tendency in recent Colombian photography and audio-visual culture based on the use of humour as a form of aesthetic outlet of adverse social conditions. It deals especially with the work of Paola Rojas, Luis Ospina and Edgar Jiménez aka El Chino. The author relates their work to the tradition of magical realism and coins the term "Macondian photography" to distinguish and characterize their work.

I really appreciate the author's effort to define a particular style, however, the examples given are too few and incoherent to substantiate such a claim. The allusions to Freud, Bergson and other conceptions of humour are rather centrifugal as well; humour comes in a wide variety of forms and facets, one would have to define much

more clearly what exactly is the typical "macondian" jocular form. Also, its relationship to magical realism (in visual arts) calls for a more thorough elaboration. Although the author did not succeed in defining a specific photographic style, he still managed to describe a characteristic tendency in recent Colombian photography and visual culture. The thesis is well researched and structured and manages to situate the photographers and their work within larger cultural, social and political contexts.

I recommend Juan's thesis for defence and suggest B as the final grade.
